#### **Loose-fill Asbestos Insulation - Free Testing for Hornsby Homeowners**

Homeowners in the Hornsby Shire now have access to free sample testing for loose-fill asbestos insulation.

Hornsby is now one of 28 local government areas (LGAs) where the NSW Government is providing free sample testing for residential properties built prior to 1980.

Owners of properties that test positive for loose-fill asbestos have the option to either sell their land and premises or premises only to the Government at market value, as if the property was not affected by loose-fill asbestos.

Owners have until 1 August 2016 to register for free testing.


# HIGHEST Award for Brooklyn GP Unit



On 16 January 2016, Brooklyn's new sports field hosted its first cricket match between Berowra and Kenthurst. Mayor Steve Russell, A Ward Councillor Nathan Tilbury and Cricket Association representatives attended. Councillor Tilbury and Hornsby Council had worked hard to establish the sporting facility, the first new ground in Hornsby in 21 years. Council has planned for further amenities to be provided in the future.

Eminent Brooklyn resident and Cricket Association Life Member Tom Richmond bowled the inaugural ball, and proposed the ground be named Seymour's Creek Sports Field after his ancestor who farmed the area, currently referred to as the Old Dairy.

Bob Davis and the BCA provided hot dogs and cold drinks to the players and spectators.

It was a successful start for the ground, now used for cricket most weekends.



#### January 2016 Wild month in Brooklyn

Brooklyn residents braved strong winds, falling trees and blackouts in the first of three storms in mid-January. Peat Street and Hawkesbury Crescent had some property damage although many residents are counting their luck. Thanks to the Brooklyn Firies who turned out late on the night to check on residents and clear pathways. And to Council who organised contractors to clear the debris.



The Peat Island Chapel was built in the 1950' and is just off the old Pacific Highway behind the former service station locally known as "the canteen".

The Chapel has always been available for use by the community and while it is no longer used by Peat Island folk it is still available for use by the people living in the river communities. The Chapel is in regular use by a small Roman Catholic congregation every Saturday afternoon and also by a small non-denominational group. At other times it has been used for naming ceremonies, weddings and funerals. It has also been used for a small musical concert.

The Chapel is not owned by any church but is owned by the State Government who continue to do maintenance as required. Cleaning of the Chapel and sweeping of it's paths is done by volunteers on an as needs basis. #### The Brooklyn Deli Story

The latest addition to Brooklyn's growing foodie offerings.

Opened in November last year by Natalia and Melanie who live on the river at Bar Point, The Brooklyn Deli is a cafe, green grocer and produce store, filling a need for fresh food and produce in the Brooklyn community.

Behind the bright yellow doors you will find the original shop floor has been polished and sealed, the walls have

been adorned with old jetty palings and ladders displaying retro collectables, and the counters built from old fence palings.

Continuing through the front cafe area you discover the deli cabinet filled with a gourmet selection of cheeses, salamis, ham and olives from some of Australia's best producers and around the world.

Take a step through into the next surprise, a great range of fresh produce sourced where possible from local growers with everything from free range eggs and fruit and vege, to local fresh juices and cold drinks.

It doesn't stop there. Continuing along the hallway opens up a whole new world for Brooklyn. Gourmet goodies can be found in the fridges, Barambah organic milks and yoghurt, Paradise beach dips, antipasto,

Pialligo bacon, Salumi salamis, Adamo's pastas to name a few. The shelves are filled with jams and relishes, pastas, sauces, and a good variety of your basic and gourmet grocery lines.

The Brooklyn Deli also carries quite a few gluten and dairy free lines from crackers to nut cheeses, pizzas, and raw sweet treats to keep everyone happy.

At the end of the hallway is a hidden oasis, the courtyard dining area where you can enjoy a coffee and cake with the weekend paper, and a catch up with friends and family.

The new menu is a must try. Bacon, eggs and kasaundi on turkish, the Buddha bowl featuring lentils, kale, Meredith goats fetta and poached eggs, a pulled pork roll, a smokey bean with ham hock chorizo burrito, smashed avocado on garlic bruschetta with goat fetta, lemon and mint.



Do yourself a favour and come and discover what hides within this little gem.
