#### A FAMILY MEDICAL CENTRE FOR BROOKLYN



If you've heard the rumours of a new medical centre opening in the old 'Don's Boats' general store - we can now confirm they are true! A group of doctors have banded together to establish a Family Medical service right here in Brooklyn. Their builders will begin fitting out 214 Brooklyn Rd shortly, and the doctors are optimistic of opening the doors in August 2024. The medical centre will have four consulting rooms - to start the centre will run with a full-time female GP and they will bring on more doctors / services (perhaps even pathology services) based on community demand. They will offer Bulk Billing on most appointments, with some more specialised appointments being privately billed. This is a very exciting development for our community.

#### LOWER MCKELL PARKING UPDATE

At Council's General Meeting on the 8 May 2024, Council considered a report with reference to correspondence received from Crown Lands, the NSW Government agency responsible for how each area of Crown Land is used throughout the State. The report was prepared by Council Officers relating to Car Parking Management – Lower McKell Park Brooklyn and resolved the following:

#### THAT Council:

- 1. Acknowledge the continuing challenges that the ongoing trial of the Brooklyn Parking scheme has presented to the local community and acknowledge correspondence received from the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure Crown Lands and Public Spaces.
- 2. Convene a meeting including interested Councillors and the General Manager or his delegate and representatives of each of the relevant community associations to provide greater clarity and understanding of the background to the officers' report and to work with the community on next steps including proposals and suggestions from the community with regard to parking.

That these next steps include consideration of the following proposals:

1. Reinstatement of timed parking in Lower McKell Park along the northern (riverside) row of the carpark in the following terms:

- i. 6am-6pm 4 hour (4P).
- ii. Retain all accessible car parking spaces.
- iii. Retain all ½ hour parking spaces.
- 2. Consideration be given to a number of potential changes that have been the subject of recent discussions, including:
  - i. Additional time restricted parking along the foreshore that may apply to weekends only.
- ii. Potential for 12P parking along the southern (hillside) row in Lower McKell Park.
  - iii. Consideration to seasonality of visitor use.

If there is failure to reach an agreed solution on the above matters, the unresolved matter or matters be returned to Council for resolution.

- 3. A further report to be provided to Council within 12 months which considers the implementation of appropriate time restrictions in McKell Park. In addition to the above, that reporting should give consideration to:
  - 1. Progress of an interim licence/lease between a

suitably constituted community-based group with Crown lands and consideration of any works required to achieve a functioning carpark in areas highlighted by the Department as potential sites.

- 2. Further consideration of other possible sites.
- 3. Updated attempts to advocate to Transport for NSW to unlock transport land and to provide improved services to Hawkesbury River Station including commuter and regular user parking for train and ferry customers and support the use of the train as a means for all to access Brooklyn.
- 4. Progress on a draft plan of management for McKell Park.
- 5. Following resolution of the above, Council recommence the place planning process for Brooklyn and brief the incoming Council on planning undertaken to date including the progress on this approach to addressing the resident parking issues.

Several meetings are planned to continue communication with our river neighbours, Councillors and Council Officers. The BCA remains confident that compromises made to reach a parking plan that, while not pleasing everyone, reflects the collective interests of our diverse community while meeting Council's obligations as Manager of Crown Land.




## PROJECT MANAGER BEGS DRIVERS TO SLOW DOWN AS WORK COMMENCES ON BOARDWALK

Have you noticed these truck signs at the western end of Brooklyn Road? Work has commenced on the boardwalk and shared pathway linking Kangaroo Point to Seymour's Creek opposite Tom Richmond Oval. The Project Manager, (Green Construction Service) informed the BCA that scrub clearing and path formation between Dolphin Marina and Kangaroo Point commenced last week.

Truck crossing signs have been installed in both directions from the intersection of Brooklyn Road with the Old Pacific Highway and Tom Richmond Oval just east of Seymour Creek.

The Project Manager begs drivers to SLOW DOWN AND BE TRUCK AWARE as most of the current work is out of sight of residents although a number of trucks will be entering and leaving Brooklyn Road. The boardwalk and shared pathway are scheduled to be completed by the end of the year.



#### UPDATE: TAKE BACK THE HIGHWAY / OLD ROAD

On 23 May 2024, a meeting was held between Matt Kean MP and the Take Back the Old Road Committee (the BCA is a participating member) to explore additional "traffic calming" opportunities. Some possible solutions that were discussed for consideration:

- Implementation of special conditions for roads with specific issues, such as the Galston Gorge and the Harbour Tunnel. These roads now have steeper fines and full-time monitoring cameras. A similar approach could be beneficial for the stretch of road between Brooklyn and Cowan to reduce the opportunity to use the road as a racetrack.
- The installation of permanent speed cameras that are located on a higher pole to avoid damage.
- Review changing the legislation for point-to-point cameras to apply to all vehicles on the roads gazetted as dangerous.
- Gazetting the Old Pacific Highway between Brooklyn and Cowan as "Black Spot Road" where exceeding the speed limit by 20km or more results in licences immediately suspended for six months with significant financial penalties. This in conjunction with point-to-point cameras would provide a big deterrent to those using the road as a racetrack.

 To lobby the EPA for inclusion in the pilot program for "noise-activated cameras" along this road and monitoring of excessive noise pollution experienced by some of the residents in the vicinity of the Old Pacific Highway.

It's not new news to most that fatalities and major accidents along the stretch of road between Brooklyn and Cowan, as a percentage of the length of km(s) would be amongst the highest in NSW. Despite all police efforts and goodwill to patrol the road together with a reduction of just 10 km/hr on 14 March 2024 has not resulted in any significant reduction in both car and motor bike crashes that have occurred since the reduction from 80 km to 70 km. There have been at least 11 reported accidents since the speed change with another motorcycle crash over the past weekend. It is acknowledged that a great many more accidents have likely occurred but not reported to police and/or requiring the assistance of emergency services. Matt Kean confirmed that he would continue supporting our efforts to make the road safer for all.



#### WHAT IS PLACE PLANNING THE BCA HEARS YOU ASK

Some who are new to the Brooklyn community have asked the BCA a number of questions and to provide information about Place Planning. Over the coming months the BCA will attempt to answer these questions and provide information relating to the progress and the process to date. Council has informed the BCA that Place Planning will not recommence until next year (2025) so we have a little time.



## WAVE GOODBYE TO THE BLUE PORTALOO(s) AT TOM RICHMOND OVAL

The local cricket and football clubs and associations, Brooklyn residents, Tom Richmond's family and visitors can finally prepare to wave goodbye to the Blue Portaloo(s) that have stood guard over the Tom Richmond Oval since 2016. Recent rain delayed commencement of construction of the new toilet facilities now scheduled to begin in the coming weeks. As funding permits, there are plans to construct changing rooms. The facility is expected to be ready in time for the first ball bowled of the cricket season in September. (for additional information see Gateway November 2023 issue on the BCA website)

On Sunday, April 21, 2024, Tony Broome represented the Brooklyn Community Association and other participants in laying a wreath in memory of the fallen at Brooklyn RSL Sub-branch annual ANZAC Day Service. ANZAC Day, April 25, is our day of national commemoration. President Derek Leslie led a moving service to remember the service and sacrifice of those fallen in the Gallipoli landings in 1915 and commemorate all who have served in military operations. This service was held at the Memorial Cenotaph in Brooklyn Park (western end of the Brooklyn Sports Ground).
